Charlotte Bredahl-Baker

For her years of volunteer work with youth, particularly through her love of horses, Charlotte Bredahl-Baker has been recognized by the Valley Foundation as a Volunteer of the Year for 2006.

Bredahl-Baker moved to the Valley in 1990 as a professional dressage trainer and real estate agent. In 1990-1992 she received grants from the United States Olympic Committee to train and compete throughout Europe. She is probably most well known for riding on the US Olympic bronze medal winning equestrian team in Barcelona in 1992.

Throughout her life, she has volunteered with many youth organizations. Over the past five years Bredahl-Baker volunteered her time as Team Leader for the top 12 junior riders at their National Championship.

In 2000, Bredahl-Baker and husband Joel became foster parents for the first time and eventually became permanent guardians for son Zach. Later that year Bredahl-Baker began mentoring three children through the Presbyterian Mentoring Program. She continues to mentor the same three children regularly. The couple also temporarily took in a second foster child in 2003.

Early in 2006, Bredahl-Baker went to Compton to check out a riding program for the inner city kids. She thought it was a great program and has been involved ever since.

As many as 15 youth visit her ranch in Buellton for riding lessons and demonstrations. Over the summer Bredahl-Baker and her husband Joel host several of the kids at the ranch for a week or


more at a time.




